**Explanation of Responses:**

- Represents the conversion of restricted stock units previously awarded to the Reporting Person upon the vesting of such restricted stock units. The Company retained 11,640 of the 33,333 shares of common stock issuable to the Reporting Person in satisfaction of the Reporting Person's individual minimum statutory tax withholding obligation at a price per share determined as of the vesting date.
- Represents restricted stock units awarded as an incentive for the Reporting Person to remain in the employ of the Company. Thirty-three and one-third percent (33 1/3%) of total units awarded vest and are payable solely in shares of common stock of the Company on each anniversary of the January 5, 2009 award date.
- Represents restricted stock units awarded as a supplemental retirement benefit that vest and are payable solely in shares of common stock of the Company six (6) months following the Reporting Person's retirement at or after age sixty-one and one-half (61 1/2).
- Performance Units are paid at the end of the three (3) consecutive calendar year performance period established under the award or, if earlier, upon death, disability or retirement. Performance Units are forfeited if employment is terminated before the end of the three (3) consecutive calendar year performance period for reasons other than death, disability or retirement. Performance Units are payable solely in cash in an amount equal to the ninety (90) day trailing average price of one (1) share of the Company's common stock determined as of the end of the three (3) consecutive calendar year performance or, if applicable, death, disability or retirement.
- Represents Performance Units which will be awarded to the Reporting Person under the Company's Equity Stock Incentive Plan upon achievement of the targeted total shareholder return for each of three (3) consecutive calendar years. The maximum number of Performance Units which may be earned is two hundred percent (200%) of the Performance Units awarded for target level performance and the minimum number of Performance Units which may be earned is zero (0) Performance Units.
- Represents restricted stock units allocated to the Reporting Person pursuant to the Company's Management Stock Purchase Plan to match restricted stock units allocated through deferral by Reporting Person of a portion of annual incentive compensation award.
- Restricted stock units are forfeited if employment is terminated prior to age sixty (60). If employment continues through age sixty (60), restricted stock units are payable solely in cash in five (5) consecutive, substantially equal annual installments beginning six (6) months following termination of employment. Each restricted stock unit is converted to cash in an amount equal to the fair market value (200 day rolling average) of one share of the Company's common stock on the date the Reporting Person's employment is terminated.
- Represents restricted stock units allocated to Reporting Person pursuant to the Company's Management Stock Purchase Plan reflecting Reporting Person's deferral of a portion of his annual incentive compensation award.
- Restricted stock units are payable solely in cash in five (5) consecutive, substantially equal annual installments beginning six (6) months following termination of employment. Each restricted stock unit is converted to cash in an amount equal to the fair market value (200 day rolling average) of one share of the Company's common stock on the date the Reporting Person's employment is terminated.

Know all by these presents, that the undersigned hereby makes, constitutes and appoints each of Gerald S. Lippes, Michael E. Storck and Paul J. Schulz, each acting individually, as the undersigned's true and lawful attorney-in-fact, with full power and authority as hereinafter described on behalf of and in the name, place and stead of the undersigned to:

(1) prepare, execute, acknowledge, deliver and file Forms 3, 4, and 5 (including any amendments thereto) with respect to the securities of Gibraltar Steel Corporation, a Delaware corporation (the "Company"), with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission, any national securities exchanges and the Company, as considered necessary or advisable under Section 16(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended from time to time (the "Exchange Act");
